Adverse Weather Procedures

Introduction

St Joseph's College will endeavour to stay open for as many pupils as possible for as long as possible and will aim to return to normality as soon as possible during any period of inclement weather, including snow.

Please note that no pupil, parent or staff member should travel to school if they cannot do so safely.

The College will restrict its opening if in the opinion of the Head, based on the best advice available to them at the time, the risk to pupils, parents and staff from travelling to school or remaining on site is too great.

If the adverse weather is likely to disrupt learning for **more than 24 hours**, we anticipate that we would move to remote learning wherever possible. This would, at a minimum, involve posting work on Teams for pupils to complete.
